It may be a scenic, a still object, or a portrait. Then try to recreate the image using the tools and materials you have at home. <p>Science:</p> <p>Mystery Science: go to mysteryscience.com. Click on the "starter list of K-5 science lessons" in the tan box at the top. Select Grade 5. Choose an activity to complete.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Scholastic Study Jams: go to studyjams.scholastic.com/studyjams/ Select Science- choose what you want to review. Suggested topics would be solar system, scientific inquiry and weather/climate.</p>	<p>Math:</p> <p>Word Prob. Writer</p> <p>Write 5 –10 word problems that include adding/subtracting fractions. Include a key.</p>	<p>SS:</p> <p>Interview a parent or grandparent about a tradition in your family. Write a page on the details of this tradition.</p>	<p>PE:</p> <p>Pick one day and create a food journal. Write down everything you eat for the day along with the calories for each item. Use food labels and/or internet to help find calories for items. Do not forget your calories for your drinks and snacks too. Add up all the calories you ate that day. Remember water is 0 calories</p> <p>Beside each item write (healthy or non-healthy).</p>
<p>Technology:</p> <p>Picture Journal</p> <p>Use any type of picture, drawings etc. to add to a weekly journal. Make use of as many pictures as you wish and you may use PowerPoint or any media platform to create a journal that represents 3-5 days of your week.</p>	<p>Free write!</p> <p>Write a one-page journal entry about anything on your mind... this could be about something you are reading, what is going on right now, or whatever you want to journal about!</p> <p>Try to journal 4 days this week!</p>	<p>Math:</p> <p>Least Common Denominator</p> <p>Create an anchor chart that details how to find a least common denominator between two fractions</p>	<p>ELA:</p> <p>15 minutes of Silent Sustained Reading</p> <p>Read for 15 minutes each day and have your parent sign off that you completed your reading each day. Do not forget</p>
